

As We Gather...

A warm & hearty welcome to you! It's a privilege and honor to worship our Crucified & Risen, Good Shepherd, Jesus, with you this second Sunday of Easter! We're all glad to have **you** here! As always, make yourself at home, you are among family!

Jesus said to Thomas, "Have you believed because you have seen Me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." Though we don't have the privilege of seeing Jesus in person as Thomas, the disciples, and many others did, we do have the privilege of seeing Jesus in the Word. We have the privilege of being touched by Jesus in Holy Baptism (Just like Decorah & Piper do today!). And we have the privilege of being in communion with Jesus in the Lord's Supper. Jesus still comes through the "locked doors" we may have and brings a blessed peace to us as He did in the flesh long ago!

Service Notes...

<u>In preparation for worship:</u> Please take some time to greet the people you are worshiping with! The order of worship for today is printed for you below, you may want to take a few minutes to look it over and mark the songs; **487**, **470**, **602**, **480**, **646** & **920** in the Lutheran Service Book (*LSB*) as you prepare to receive the gifts of God and sing His praises. **Reminder:** If you have a smart phone, and you're on Facebook, please "check in" at *Good Shepherd* Lutheran Church...then turn the sound off! May our Good and Gracious Shepherd bless your worship this day...this NEW day of salvation!

<u>To Stand or Sit:</u> There are certain parts of the service where you will be invited to stand. Sometimes, "wrestling" with kids, or a personal health condition makes standing uncomfortable... please know: <u>It is okay to either stand or sit. Both are appropriate!</u> So please, make yourself comfortable, receive the gifts God loves to give and **BOLDLY** sing His praises!

Children: We are blessed to have a lot of young families and young children here at **Good Shepherd**. We take Jesus' words very seriously when He says, "Let the little children come to me..." We also know how difficult it can be to keep children sitting quietly for any period of time, much less an hour long church service! For your convenience, "Quiet Bags" have been provided for young worshippers. They are located in the narthex to your right (on the "Noah's Ark" wall mounting, next to the big bulletin board) when exiting the sanctuary. Also, for your convenience, a "Quiet Room" is located at the back of the sanctuary for use during those "difficult" times. Also, please keep in mind that everyone here loves to have the children here and will help you in any way they can! **Please note:** We may have a children's message which could be recorded via Facebook live. If you have any issues with your child being seen at church on the World Wide Web just listen from the pew!

Guests, Visitors & The Offering: If you are our guest today, you are <u>not</u> expected to contribute monetarily to God's work at *Good Shepherd* ... you are our guest! Please take this service as our gift to you! But please do take a minute to check in at one of our kiosks in the atrium and sign the guestbook so we can thank you for your visit...and come soon to see us again! If you choose to give an offering, know this: **The gifts we give back to God are used by His church to transform lives.** (The offering plate is located at the sanctuary entrance).

The Lord's Supper: (10:30 am) Good Shepherd joyfully celebrates the Lord's Supper, and we do that in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another Matthew 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-25. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes Matthew 5:23; 18:15-35. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm 1 Corinthians 11:27-29 and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession Matthew 10:32 differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor. Because Scripture says we ought to "examine ourselves" before receiving the Holy Meal 1 Corinthians 11:28, it is recommended that we review the "Christian Questions with Their Answers" section of the LSB before communion (page 329 of the LSB), please take a few moments before the service or during the offering to do so. Thank you! Please note: There are two or three cups at the center of each tray that are non-alcoholic wine for those who prefer such for personal or medical reasons (The wine containing alcohol is white, the non-alcohol is red/pink).

Pre-Service Meditation...

Please check out some of the pre-service prayers in the front of the LSB and/or meditate on one or more of the Psalms printed in the LSB (specifically **Psalm 148** today)...or just spend some time quietly in prayer before we begin...AND/OR, read this...

"Cutting Edge Ministry"

And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes of both men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets and laid them on cots and mats that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them. Acts 5: 14-15

Cutting-edge ministry is an often-used phrase today. It becomes a goal to which people aspire. We want our Sunday school to be on the cutting edge; our evangelism program to be on the cutting edge; and our worship program to be on the cutting edge. Hundreds of people have written hundreds of

books and articles how to modernize and perfect their ministries, and our churches have listened to these suggestions. Some we find helpful and some are confusing and frightening. It is difficult to believe that the success or failure of a ministry could depend on a list of dos and don'ts or on a certain style of worship or youth ministry. Peter didn't have a worship facility in which to preach; he escaped the controversy over contemporary or traditional music; he didn't have a problem with child care or "Baby Boomers" or "Gen X-Y-Z-ers"...not to mention LGBTQ, or whatever. He did deal with Romans, Greeks, and Jews who practiced everything from hedonism to nationalism. He had none of the benefits of today's sociological studies, but his ministry was so successful that people tried to sit in his shadow, hoping for a blessing. With all due respect to those who try to improve ministry through various strategies, what really makes ministries cutting edge is God's Word at work through His servants. People will see Jesus when we love them, offer ministries and programs that meet their needs, and give up non-scriptural practices that people do not understand. Therefore, as we plan and pray, ask the Spirit of God to help churches grow in faith and show Jesus' love. When that happens, people will see God's Word in action and come to salvation.

Dear God, thank You for saving us through faith in Jesus Christ. We long to serve You as we bring Your saving Word to the world. Let Your Spirit so rule in our hearts that we might show Jesus in all that we say and do. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Acts 5:12-20 (*Peter and John proclaim the risen Christ in spite of opposition.*)

The apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders among the people. And all the believers used to meet together in Solomon's Colonnade. ¹³ No one else dared join them, even though they were highly regarded by the people. ¹⁴ Nevertheless, more and more men and women believed in the Lord and were added to their number. ¹⁵ As a result, people brought the sick into the streets and laid them on beds and mats so that at least Peter's shadow might fall on some of them as he passed by. ¹⁶ Crowds gathered also from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing their sick and those tormented by evil^a spirits, and all of them were healed. ¹⁷ Then the high priest and all his associates, who were members of the party of the Sadducees, were filled with jealousy. ¹⁸ They arrested the apostles and put them in the public jail. ¹⁹ But during the night an angel of the Lord opened the doors of the jail and brought them out. ²⁰ "Go, stand in the temple courts," he said, "and tell the people the full message of this new life." This is the Word of the Lord.

blood, ⁶ and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father—to him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen.

John 20:19-31 (Thomas confronts Jesus with his doubts and Jesus confronts him with His wounds to show that the news of the resurrection is true.)

Pastor: The Gospel according to St. John, the twenty-first chapter.

All: Glory to You, O Lord.

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.

²¹ Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." ²² And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." ²⁴ Now Thomas (called Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe it." ²⁶ A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe." ²⁸ Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹ Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." ³⁰ Jesus did many other miraculous signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. ³¹ But these are written that you may^a believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name. This is the Gospel of the Lord.
