As We Gather...

*A warm & hearty welcome to you! It's a privilege and honor to worship our Crucified, Risen, Ascended & Glorified Lord with you this day. We're glad to have **you** here. As always, make yourself at home, you are among family!*

The First Sunday after the Epiphany takes us in mind and heart to the Jordan River, where Jesus is baptized. This day, observed each year in the Church, is a reminder of the importance of Baptism in the life of every Christian, for it is in dying with Christ through Baptism that we are born anew to eternal life. Although we may have not been baptized in the river Jordan, we share with our Lord the experience of being baptized. Through Baptism, we are connected to Christ and given a whole new way of living for time and for eternity. "But I am baptized!" Martin Luther would exclaim when life situations seemed overwhelming. Knowing that we live daily in baptismal grace makes the difference in our lives as well.

Service Notes...

In preparation for worship: Please take some time to greet the people you are worshiping with! The order of worship is printed for you below, please take a few minutes to familiarize yourself with the service before we begin. You may also want to mark the songs: **411, 405, 601 & 917** in the Lutheran Service Book (*LSB*) before we begin. ***Another Reminder:*** If you have a smart phone, and you're on Facebook, please "check in" at ***Good Shepherd*** Lutheran Church...then turn the sound off! May our Good and Gracious Shepherd bless your worship this day...this NEW day of salvation!

To Stand or Sit: There are certain parts of the service where you will be invited to stand. Sometimes, "wrestling" with kids, or a personal health condition makes standing uncomfortable... please know: **It is okay to either stand or sit. Both are appropriate!** So please, make yourself comfortable, receive the gifts God loves to give and **BOLDLY** sing His praises!

Children: We are blessed to have a lot of young families and young children here at ***Good Shepherd***. We take Jesus' words very seriously when He says, "Let the little children come to me..." We also know how difficult it can be to keep children sitting quietly for any period of time, much less an hour long church service! For your convenience, "Quiet Bags" have been provided for young worshippers. They are located in the narthex to your right (on the "Noah's Ark" wall mounting, next to the big bulletin board) when exiting the sanctuary. Also, for your convenience, a "Quiet Room" is located at the back of the sanctuary for use during those "difficult" times. Also, please keep in mind that everyone here loves to have the children here and will help you in any way they can! **Please note:** *Non-communion services may have a children's message which could be recorded via Facebook live. If you have any issues with your child being seen at church on the World Wide Web just listen from the pew!*

Guests, Visitors & The Offering: If you are our guest today, you are **not** expected to contribute monetarily to God's work at ***Good Shepherd*** ... you are our guest! Please take this service as our gift to you! The Opening Song: "I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light"

The Invocation & Opening Verses

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. *Matthew 28:19b; [18-20]*

All: Amen.

Pastor: Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

All: We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.” *Romans 6:3-4*

We Confess Our Sins [1 John 1:8-9]

Pastor: We must confess that none of us “walks in newness of life” each day; however, since our Lord took our sins on Himself, our sins have been washed away in the water of Baptism. The promises the Father made to Him are ours. He said, “I am the Lord; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you” (*Isaiah 42:6*). Let us therefore confess our sins, confident that Christ's righteousness will be graciously credited to us.

(Silence for reflection on the Word of God and for self-examination.)

Pastor: Heavenly Father,

All: although, as Isaiah prophesied, our Lord would not break a bruised reed or quench a faintly burning wick, but would faithfully bring forth justice (*Isaiah 42:3*) **— we confess that we have walked in the ways of this world. We have sought power and prestige for ourselves, but have neglected those less fortunate than ourselves; we have rejoiced in our freedom, but have forgotten those in prison; we have basked in Your gracious forgiveness, but have failed to extend it to the people we meet. Forgive us, renew us, and assure us again that through the water of Baptism Jesus' righteousness is now our own.**

We Hear God's Forgiveness [John 20:19-23]

Pastor: In the water of His Baptism our Lord “fulfilled all righteousness.” The Father's approval, “with Him I am well pleased,” is spoken over all who have been baptized in His name. God proclaimed through Isaiah, “Behold, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare” (*Isaiah 42:9*). Therefore as a called and ordained servant of Christ and by His authority I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Alleluia, Amen! May the Lord give strength to His people! May the Lord bless His people with peace! *Psalms 29:11*

We Sing: “To Jordan's River Came Our Lord”
(LSB pg. 405)

The Kyrie (Lord, have mercy)

Pastor: In peace let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Pastor: For the peace that comes down from above with the news of God's approval for the sake of our Savior who fulfilled all righteousness for us, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Pastor: For peace in this chaotic world, for the well-being of the Church of God, and for the unity of all the baptized, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Pastor: For this holy house and for all who gather here for strength in adversity, guidance in confusion, and forgiveness in failures of faith, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Pastor: Help, save, comfort and defend us, gracious Lord.

All: Amen.

Pastor: The Lord be with you. *2 Timothy 4:22*

All: And also with you.

(A prayer is spoken...)

+ We Hear God's Word +

Isaiah 42:1–9 (The Lord speaks about His Servant and addresses Him.)

"Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he will bring justice to the nations. ² He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets.

³ A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; ⁴ he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his law the islands will put their hope." ⁵ This is what God the Lord says— he who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and all that comes out of it, who gives breath to its people, and life to those who walk on it: ⁶ "I, the Lord, have called you in righteousness; I will take hold of your hand. I will keep you and will make you to be a covenant for the people and a light for the Gentiles, ⁷ to open eyes that are blind, to free captives from prison and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness. ⁸ "I am the Lord; that is my name! I will not give my glory to another or my praise to idols. ⁹ See, the former things have taken place, and new things I declare; before they spring into being I announce them to you." ... This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God!

Romans 6:1–11 (Our Baptism unites us both to Christ's death and also to His resurrection.)

What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? ² By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? ³ Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. ⁵ If we have been united with him like this in his death, we will certainly also be united with him in his resurrection. ⁶ For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be done away with,^a that we should no longer be slaves to sin— ⁷ because anyone who has died has been freed from sin. ⁸ Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹ For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. ¹⁰ The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. ¹¹ In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus... This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God!

Pastor: Alleluia. You are My beloved Son;

All: with You I am well pleased. *Mark 1:11b* **Alleluia!**

Children's Message: "Alive in Christ"

Matthew 3:13–17 (Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan.)

Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. ¹⁴ But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" ¹⁵ Jesus replied, "Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness." Then John consented. ¹⁶ As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and lighting on him. ¹⁷ And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." ... This is the Gospel of our Lord.

All: Praise to You, O Christ!

We Affirm Our Faith (The Apostles' Creed) [Romans 10:9] . . .

Pastor: Let us remember our Baptism by again renouncing the devil and confessing our faith responsively...Do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?

All: I do renounce them.

Pastor: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?

All: Yes, I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?

All: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Pastor: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

All: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life + everlasting. Amen.

Pastor: You have been baptized into the death and resurrection of Christ; therefore, consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

All: Amen. Thanks be to God.

The Prayer of the Church [1 Timothy 2:1-4]

(The Pastor will conclude each short petition with the words, "Lord, in Your mercy..."

Please respond with, "Hear our prayer.")

The Lord's Prayer

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Matthew 6:9-13 For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

The Blessing

Pastor: The blessing of God Almighty—the Father, who gave His Son for the life of the world; the Son, who has revealed to us God’s grace, mercy, and love; and the Spirit, by whose fruit we are seen to be children of God—bless you now and forever.

All: Amen!

MISSION OF THE MONTH: You are the light of the world! Damascus Road Project, Inc. is a local, non-profit organization run mostly by volunteers and is Good Shepherd's January Mission of the Month! Damascus Road is a light in the darkness of human sex trafficking and a soft, safe place to land for victims of sex trafficking. These women and their children must flee their unsafe residence, usually on the spur of the moment, without preparation, and only the clothes on their back. They are terrified, feel alone, and have nothing. Damascus Road reaches out to these victims, brings them in, and provides them with basic needs, education, and training that teaches them Jesus is their Lord and Savior and He will be with them as they learn to lift themselves out of the depths of darkness. We can help by praying for their rescue and healing, providing (full-size) personal hygiene products, and offering financial support.
