As We Gather...

A warm & hearty welcome to you! It's a privilege and honor to worship our Crucified, Risen, Ascended & Glorified Good Shepherd, Jesus, with you this Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany!

*We're all glad to have **you** here! As always, make yourself at home, you are among family!*

The Sermon of the Mount is the longest recorded discourse of our Lord Jesus Christ. Its purpose is twofold. First, Jesus teaches that the Law is not fulfilled by keeping ourselves respectable in the eyes of the world or in other words, no man is good enough in God's sight to save his own soul. Second, Jesus teaches what we are to do to please God. Having been saved by His grace, we want to do His will. Here it is. The Law serves as a rule and regulation for Christian living. In the following sentences of the Sermon on the Mount, we have Christ's roster of who's who. Qualifications for admission into this registry are quaint and unique, judged by the standards of this world. Money does not count, neither does power or success. "How difficult it is to enter the kingdom of God!" (Mark 10:24). "Whoever seeks to preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life will keep it" (Luke 17:33).

Service Notes...

In preparation for worship: Please take some time to greet the people you are worshiping with! The order of worship for today is Divine Service *Setting One* found on **page 151** in the Lutheran Service Book (*LSB*). To avoid having to flip back and forth between this bulletin and the *LSB*, some of the liturgy and the scripture readings are printed for you below. Please take a few minutes to look over the order of worship before we begin. In addition, you may want to mark the songs: **705, 842, 947, 850, 932 & 643** in the *LSB* as you prepare for worship (*even if you "don't sing," please read along! Lutheran hymnody carries some deep Theological messages!*). If you have a smart phone, and you're on Facebook, remember to check in at **Good Shepherd** Lutheran Church...then turn the sound off! May God seriously bless your worship this day...a new day of salvation!

To Stand or Sit: There are certain parts of the service where you will be invited to stand. Sometimes, "wrestling" with kids, or a personal health condition makes standing uncomfortable... please know: **It is okay to either stand or sit. Both are appropriate!** So please, make yourself comfortable, receive the gifts God loves to give and **BOLDLY** sing His praises!

Children: We are blessed to have a lot of young families and young children here at **Good Shepherd**. We take Jesus' words very seriously when He says, "Let the little children come to me..." We also know how difficult it can be to keep children sitting quietly for any period of time, much less an hour long church service! For your convenience, "Quiet Bags" have been provided for young worshippers. They are located in the narthex to your right (on the "Noah's Ark" wall mounting, next to the big bulletin board) when exiting the sanctuary. Also, for your convenience, a "Quiet Room" is located at the back of the sanctuary for use during those "difficult" times.

Please note: *Non-communion services may have a children's message which could be recorded via Facebook live. If you have any issues with your child being seen at church on the World Wide Web just listen from the pew!*

Guests, Visitors & The Offering: If you are our guest today, you are **not** expected to contribute monetarily to God's work at **Good Shepherd** ... you are our guest! Please take this service as our gift to you! But please do take a minute to check in at one of our kiosks in the atrium and sign the guestbook so we can thank you for your visit...and come soon to see us again! If you choose to give an offering, know this: **The gifts we give back to God are used by His church to transform lives.** (*The Offering plate is located at the entrance to the Church Sanctuary*)

The Lord's Supper: (*Thursday & Sunday at 8:00 am*) **Good Shepherd** joyfully celebrates the Lord's Supper, and we do that in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another *Matthew 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-25*. **Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes** *Matthew 5:23; 18:15-35*. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm *1 Corinthians 11:27-29* and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession *Matthew 10:32* differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor. Because Scripture says we ought "examine ourselves" before receiving the Holy Meal *1 Corinthians 11:28*, it is recommended that we review the "Christian Questions with Their Answers" section of the *LSB* before communion (pg. 329), please take a few moments before the service or during the offering to do so. Thank you! **Please note: There are two or three cups at the center of each tray that are non-alcoholic wine for those who prefer such for personal or medical reasons (The wine containing alcohol is white, the non-alcohol is red/pink).**

The Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:18–31 (The Word of the Cross)

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.¹⁹ For it is written: “*I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate.*”^a ²⁰ Where is the wise man? Where is the scholar? Where is the philosopher of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?²¹ For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe.²² Jews demand miraculous signs and Greeks look for wisdom,²³ but we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles,²⁴ but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.²⁵ For the foolishness of God is wiser than man's wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than man's strength.²⁶ Brothers, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth.²⁷ But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong.²⁸ He chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are,²⁹ so that no one may boast before him.³⁰ It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption.³¹ Therefore, as it is written: “*Let him who boasts boast in the Lord.*”^b ...This is the Word of the Lord.

UPDATE: As you may know, the church has moved to a new software system to make it a bit easier on the Treasurer. This new software should be very helpful to provide summary of income vs budget amounts; however, moving forward, these amounts will begin to be provided in the bulletin monthly at the beginning of the month. For example, January amounts will be provided on the first or second Sunday in February; February's will be provided in the beginning of March, etc. We will also try to add it to the Monday email. These amounts are also provided in the bi-monthly Newsletter. The total budget approved in December was \$413,140 which translates to \$7,943 weekly or \$34,430 monthly.
