2020 Trustee Year End Report

Kone elevator of Appleton was called to give us a second opinion on the issue we were having with random shutdowns of our elevator. Since the reversing relay was replaced on Monday Oct 26th the elevator has been operating properly.

In as much as Kone Elevator of Appleton was able to diagnose and repair the elevator when Otis wasn't able to, we have decided to Contract with Kone for elevator quarterly inspections as required and "on call" maintenance in lieu of continuing with Otis.

In July several minor roof repairs were completed and there have been no reoccurring leaks.

In September we had to replace one of the original building furnaces (about 35 years old) and one of the air-conditioners for the worship area was diagnosed as deceased. The air-conditioner will be replaced in the spring. Given the age of our building and infrastructure we can expect repair expenses will be larger in the future than they have been in past years.

With winter on us the parking lot snow removal contract is taken care of using the contractor from previous years.

Sidewalk snow removal is accomplished by volunteers; there is a signup sheet in the narthex. As always there is an ongoing need for volunteers for snow blowing and lawn care.

Volunteers are the lifeblood of a functioning church without them our earthly life would be much coarser. We enjoy the services of many good volunteers but we can always use more.

Services were provided in various ways to try and provide access for everyone depending on needs and comfort level. Masks and social distancing were implemented with disinfecting pews in between services. Several of our members contracted the virus.

We had to make some rapid changes for the Christmas services. We were fortunate to have assistance from the newly installed Pastor Pemberton of Trinity Oshkosh. He assisted with two baptisms and two Christmas Eve services. We appreciate his willingness to step in and look forward to having continued interaction with them.

During the year of Covid-19 we had wonderful parking lot services for Easter and Reformation Sunday being able to use electronics to enhance the services. We would again like to thank Pastor Koepsell for providing refreshing messages, Cam Bedroske and the choir for the music and Jacob Bedroske for his electronic expertise. We also want to thank everyone that has been involved with the taping of the services.

Even though during this time our physical attendance has been smaller, our members have been very faithful in various ways including stewardship that has allowed us to meet our operating expenses and even pay down our mortgage substantially.

Our adult choir is smaller, but they have occasionally been able to offer singing, to help glorify the Lord. A small group has been able to sing to some of our members at Evergreen Manor outside their rooms.

Our Sunday school has not been in session, but the leaders have tried to provide materials to the families of Sunday school children.

Bible studies were suspended for a while but are starting up in January 2021.

There are 27 students in confirmation and have been broken down into three classes.

Your assigned Elder is always open to hear from you with any concerns. Please use them as a resource whenever needed.

A special thanks to all of the Elders as this Covid-19 has required us to make adjustments with various services.

We pray that all of our members are safe and we look forward to getting back to our full ministry as soon as possible.

2021 work program

- 1. Support and assist the Pastor with his overall ministry at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church
 - Provide Elder coverage for all church services so they are conducted in good order with assistance from the music director, ushers, altar care, acolytes, decorations, etc.
 - Regular Services and special services such as: Lent, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, Advent, Christmas, parking lot services, park service and any other special services such as the Lenten Meditation service and any other public worship.

2020 Stewardship Year End Report

As we say goodbye to 2020 and welcome in 2021, I encourage all of us to stop and thank God for his faithfulness to us over the past year. Despite the MANY challenges we all faced as individuals and as a family of faith, God has blessed us considerably over the past year. As Stewardship Chair, I would like to highlight the five most important projects we were involved in this past year:

1. Financial Stewardship -- You may want to sit down before reading this. At the end of November, 2019, just 13 months ago, our mortgage balance sat at \$467,627.80, nearly half a million dollars! At the end of this past December, 2020, our mortgage balance was down to \$194,950.67. In just over one year--in the midst of a pandemic--we paid off more than \$270,000. This happened through the remarkable generosity of many families and individuals in our congregation. Even though it hurt, this church continued to give in support of the life-changing Gospel being shared at and through Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. Thanks be to our Mighty God!

- 2. Mission Stewardship -- This past fall, the congregation was invited to a series of strategic planning meetings led by President Keith Casey and supported by the Stewardship Board. We talked through some of our strengths and weaknesses as a congregation and identified some of the challenges and opportunities facing our church in this culture and community. We also began crafting a mission and vision statement to guide our future plans. With our mortgage close to being paid off, we intend for this strategic planning to continue in the new year so we can be well situated with actionable plans for the future of our church. If you haven't yet attended, look for announcements for the next round of meetings.
- 3. Volunteer Stewardship -- While stewardship is often considered to be just about money, I believe Good Shepherd Church is called to carefully steward all of the gifts given to us by God. More precious than offering envelopes and Joyful Giving and the beautiful souls entrusted to our care. God has called each of us to this church for our good and His glory. In fact, this ministry could not occur without the dedicated and faithful gifts of time and talents that so many of us give. Near the end of last year, I asked the church council and other leaders within the congregation to send me a list of all the volunteers they worked with over the course of the year. The number of names I received surprised and thrilled me. According to our best estimates, 168 individuals from 100 families donated their time to carry out the work of Good Shepherd in 2020. In recognition of your volunteerism, the Board of Stewardship purchased gift cards to GrubHub for all our volunteers. We hope to have an in-person meal to celebrate in the coming year, but for now, please receive our hearty and well-deserved thanks for your service to God, and this congregation.
- 4. SCRIP Program -- Among our many amazing volunteers, I'd like to single out Jeff and Linda Everson for special thanks. Even with reduced church attendance and a time when we didn't meet at all, Jeff and Linda have been faithfully stewarding our SCRIP program. Because they invest themselves in being available, answering questions, taking and making orders, the church was able to receive approximately \$2,400 in 2020 through their efforts and through your SCRIP card purchases. What's more amazing is that this total is only slightly lower than last year's final amount. We are so blessed to have this tag-team couple working faithfully for the financial health of our congregation.
- 5. Connecting Well Survey -- Although it got overshadowed by last year's circumstances, we revised the previous time and talents survey to help us get a sense of where and how our members would like to get involved in the ministry of Good Shepherd. In all, just under 50 members completed the survey, but through their responses we were able to identify and approach several members to serve on the church council, as well as to assist with other board service. We will continue to use these responses as we work on our strategic planning and to increase our volunteerism in 2021.
