New Business:

President Casey welcomed Jennifer Charles as our new chair of *Board of Education*. *Judy Mehn will co-chair.*

Board of Elders – Gary Bedroske: Music Directors report: Cam has the hymns and liturgies set up until June 16th. Lenten meditation service to be held on Palm Sunday in 2020. Pastor had made a suggestion to have it on Good Friday but it would be difficult to have other musicians and the feeling is that many of the individuals that have attended would go to their own for their Good Friday service. We will be hosting the circuit Ascension service on Thursday, 5/30 with an estimate 200 people to attend. Clergy will handle communion. Pastors report: Next group of new members will be acknowledged in June or July depending on schedules. Lenten worship 2019 weekly average attendance was 129 vs 2018 of 99. Maundy Thursday 2019 attendance was 122 vs 2018 of 121. Good Friday 2019 attendance was 104 and 106 for a total of 210 vs 2018 of 86 and 75 for a total of 161. Easter 2019 attendance was 385 vs 2018 of 310. 1 baptism. No funerals or weddings in March. Pastor participated in the blessings of the bikes in Milwaukee. Confirmation instructions are going well. 6th and 7th graders will end on 5/18/19. 8th grade exam on 6/2/19. Suggested by Pastor that each Elder prepare a question for the exam. Pastor Koepsell and Pastor Hayman are making shut in calls. Gary Bedroske went on several calls with Pastor Koepsell and he encouraged other Elders to make themselves available to do the same as it is very worthwhile. Pastor asked for prayers for the youth going to the national convention. Also, prayers for Mike Radloff, Pat Koltz and others that have various needs. Pastor thanked the Elders for all their work and assistance and emphasized the great value our congregation has with the number of organist and our senior choir. Fred Kirchenwitz will substitute for Rick Dittberner as Elder on Thursday 5/23/19. The communion rotation would be 1st and 3rd Sundays early service, 2nd and 4th Sundays late service. Notice of services for communion will be in the church bulletin. Linda Everson's last day as being Sunday School Superintendent will be 5/18/19. Flowers will be given in appreciation for her service. Jennifer Charles has agreed to take over being the Sunday School Superintendent with co-chair Judy Mehn. Pastor discussed Sunday School and that he needed to help with inspiration. A suggestion was made that he handles the opening part of Sunday School and Pastor agreed that is a good suggestion. Men's group have decided on studying "Wall of Separations".

Board of Stewardship – Noah Hinrichs (absent Chad Smith reporting): PenPal is pending.

Board of Evangelism – Vivian Mittelstaedt: Lifetouch took photos of new members. The updated directory should be available in mid-June and everyone will receive a new photo directory. Pizza Ranch was a huge success. Vivian will check with Festival for available dates for the Brat Barn. This past Lenten season, Good Shepherd decided to support the Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch in North Dakota by donating free will offerings given during Lenten meals. A total of \$500 was sent. Thank you to those who generously gave to this wonderful Christian ministry and also to Thrivent Financial for providing the seed money to purchase food for the meals. May 4th members volunteered to pack meals for Feed My Starving Children. The whole group at the fairgrounds packed 67,384 meals, feeding 185 children for a year.

Board of Education – Linda Everson: A celebration was held on Sunday, May 19th to celebrate our Sunday School year. We celebrated with cake, bible trivia, and certificates were handed out. VBS supplies have been ordered. Thanks for the flowers and gifts.

Board of Trustee – Mike Kirchoff: There was a discussion about the quotes for our parking lot. Mike will investigate and speak with Craig Dreger. Motion M/S/C to replace the office air conditioner. Discussion followed about replacing church light bulbs.

Board of Fellowship – Sharon Leinweber and Lori Purath – Will be serving a luncheon to the choirs on May 23rd as we will be hosting the Ascension service. Also, will be serving refreshments and desserts after Ascension service. Will be preparing snacks for VBS and assist with the VBS potluck.
