Wow did summer fly by! The family and I have spent many hours at the baseball diamond with the boys. Great fun, great friends, and great family time.



Giving Cheerfully

At our last Voter's Meeting on June 26th we had a very "lively" discussion about money. Good Shepherd is in a very unique position that most other churches are not. We have paid off the mortgage on the building and find ourselves with some excess funds, along with a lot of opinions on how they should be used. The Strategic Planning Committee has surveyed the congregation and prioritized some of the categories where the church could use some improving. Everything from the lighting to the sound system, to painting the walls in the church proper. All are very worthwhile expenditures! Many of our members want to donate specifically to these items, as was done with the new sign out front. I would like to thank them all for their incredible generosity, but I think it's important to look back and see how we got this point.



Not too long ago, our church was in a very different financial and communicant position. Attendance was down, as were our funds, and we were without a permanent pastor. The church went through the call process, and by a unanimous vote we called Pastor Koepsell. Suddenly, Good Shepherd had a caring, dynamic preacher who could communicate with you if you were aged 8 or 80. Word got out and soon people started coming to see what was going on at the corner of Westhaven and 9th. Knowing Pastor Koepsell, he would be embarrassed and maybe even a little angry with me for portraying him in this light. So to be clear, I'm not saying he is the ONLY reason that Good Shepherd is thriving, but I believe you can't deny that the Holy Spirit is working through him! Pastor once told me that it's easy to be a pastor. Write and preach a good sermon and love people and all the other stuff will fall into place. I believe that's true to a point, because our congregation has grown so much that we are now at a membership number that is almost twice what most pastors handle and I see it beginning to wear on him.

At the beginning of this letter I wrote about the Voter's Meeting and money and the opinions on how to spend it. In my humble opinion I would like us to see if we could start the process of calling an associate pastor. Someone Pastor Koepsell could work with to continue to further the ministry here at Good Shepherd. This is not something that will be easy or quick, but most things worth having don't come easily or quickly. Unlike the expenditures I mentioned earlier, these are not a one time purchase, but instead will become a line item in the budget. Many steps will need to be taken before this comes to fruition. Steps like a needs assessment, a job description, and of course, whether it is it financially possible, just to name a few.

2nd Corinthians 9: 7-8 says, "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work." So that is my challenge to the congregation, that we may abound in every good work and seriously look into what it takes to continue to move the ministry forward in regards to staffing and what each one of us can do to make that happen.

VBS—In The Jungle

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. ~Matthew 5:4

In Burma, one of the biggest needs is for children's uninterrupted education and interaction with other children. Many parents are too afraid to send their children to school due to the constant passage of fighter jets over the villages. They prefer to keep the children within arm's reach, effectively closing the local schools. In early May, together with local teachers, we helped combat this fear and bring joy in several villages through short VBS style programs called the Good Life Club. In five locations, both villages and jungle camps, we reached over 600 children who came out to see skits, sing, dance, play games and laugh. We helped encourage them emotionally and spiritually. Fear has no home where children are laughing and singing. Depending on the location, programs lasted 2 to 3 hours. After the children's programs, Stephen together with a local teacher had many opportunities to minister to adults. They reached about 360 adults with separate preaching and teaching programs. People were exceedingly hungry for God's word as the gospel brought peace and healing.

In one location, Khuafo Village, about 60 villagers gathered and talked openly about a bombing that killed 9 people in their village in March. Through tears, one man talked about losing his two sisters. Another talked about losing his wife and daughter. Another cried as he said he missed his daughters Lenzi and Sofia. This was the first time they had been able to talk openly about what happened. Several people told us our visit made them realize they are not alone. The time we took to be with them and listen was a powerful reminder that Jesus is always with them and listens to their prayers. Talking about what happened, praying about it, and pointing to God's promises brought them true peace and joy.

We are the Wiesenauer Family, Stephen and Krista and our children Lydia, Josiah, Greta, and Micah. Our work is funded 100% by the financial support of friends like you! 
LWML
