Six Little Stories with Lots of Meanings


- 1. Once all villagers decided to pray for rain. On the day of prayer all the people gathered, but only one boy came with an umbrella. That is faith.

Reflections on family

I thank God for my family and all their love and support over the years. The first half of 2022 saw some major events in my family's story. In late February, my father went home to be with the Lord. Then in early June, we celebrated a wedding, as my nephew Sam and his wife Victoria started their life together. Realizing that I needed to move back to Wisconsin to be closer to my family, I made that transition in late April (see my new address in the margin, right). The part of my work that required my physical presence in Texas can now be done online; most of the rest of my work already happens online. I can really be based anywhere at this point, and I'm grateful that the Lord has led me back to my home state.



Training surveyors

During January-May I taught an online course for Dallas International University, and then June-July found me back in Uganda for iDEL-TA (Institute for the Development of Languages and Translation in Africa). Following up on what we taught last year, my co-teacher and I gave a course on language survey methods, with lots of hands-on practice (see photo above). I'm blessed to be involved in equipping others to find the remaining Bible translation needs worldwide.

Linguistics conference

On my way back from Uganda in early August, I attended a linguistics conference in Germany. This was a great opportunity to grow in knowledge of current research methods, important for me as I develop and provide training in language survey. I was also able to raise awareness of and promote the Angolan language atlas by presenting a paper about our language mapping project completed in partnership with the Angolan Ministry of Culture.
